Increase to Recreation Fees

Effective September 1, 2023, recreation rate changes occurred for the following services:

- Daily admission at the Collicutt Centre, Recreation Center, Michener Centre, Servus Arena, Kinsmen Community Arenas and Setters Place at Great Chief Park.
- · Monthly Recreation All Access passes and Recreation Value Pass
- \cdot 10 Punch passes at all the above-mentioned facilities.
- · Group admission fees at the above-mentioned facilities
- · Childminding fees at the Collicutt Centre and G.H. Dawe Community Centre
- · Facility Rental Fees

The recreation Plus Pass fee was adjusted with the opening of the newly expanded G.H. Dawe Community Centre in February and will not receive another adjustment in September.

Training and **Professional Development**

Concussion and Injury prevention:

Canadians, especially those involved in sport and recreation. If not properly recognized or diagnosed, concussions can have lifelong effects on a person. Starting in 2021, concussion awareness week was released across Canada and continues its third year from September 24-30, 2023. The week aims to increase awareness and knowledge for all stakeholders in sport and recreation, whether you are a coach, parent, athlete/participant, coach, official or organizer. The Sport Resources Information Centre (SIRC) has resources available for all involved in sport and recreation to access during this week to educate yourself on concussion awareness and management. Check them out here.

Also in 2021, the Canadian Minister of Sport and Physical Activity announced that all nationally funded sport organizations were mandated to have concussion policies. It is important to keep up to date with your organizations concussion management policy and protocols. If you are unsure, sit them out!
