### Facility **News and Updates**

#### LiveBarn

LiveBarn is now in City of Red Deer arena's! LiveBarn cameras have been installed at the Collicutt Centre, G.H. Dawe Community Centre, Kinsmen Twin Arena's and Servus Arena. This new technology allows teams to live stream their games and practices for family and friends to watch when they are unable to attend in person. If your team wishes to keep games and practices private, please connect with us to opt out of the service during the facility booking process.

When you subscribe to LiveBarn, you will have access to all venues where it is installed. In Alberta alone there are over 100 arenas equipped with LiveBarn technology.

#### Community Recreation Enhancement Grant (CREG):

The Community Recreation Enhancement Grant (CREG) is a City of Red Deer grant program that provides financial support to not-for-profit organizations delivering recreation initiatives in our community. In 2023 the City of Red Deer granted \$99,000.00 to 22 local organization to support recreational initiatives within our community through the Grant. The programs and services our not-for-profit organizations offer are essential to the health and wellness of our community. We at the City recognize the efforts all these groups and are honored to support their efforts. #### Value-Based Coaching: A True Sport Approach

The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) is now offering the "Values Based Coaching: A True Sport Approach e-learning course for coaches of all sports. This course will have coaches reflect on personal values, their coaching philosophy and what motivates them as a coach. The course using "True Sport Principles" will give coaches tools and resources to create positive and enriching experiences for the athletes they work with. This course will connect your NCCP locker account and will give you 2 credits towards maintain your certified or trained status. For more information click here.

#### High Five: Principles of Healthy Child Development

The City of Red Deer will be hosting opportunities for High Five Training in the Principles of Healthy Child Development stream. High five is Canada's only quality standard training for working with school aged children 4-12 years of age and is a great resource for coaches or volunteers working with these ages in sport and focuses on a child first approach. High Five is based off 5 principles and 3 design guidelines which will help guide you to help children feel welcomed, safe, included, and cared for. Studies have shown that having a Caring Adult in children's programs and sporting activities increases their sense of belonging, inclusion and safety making them more inclined to continue and stay involved with the program.
