

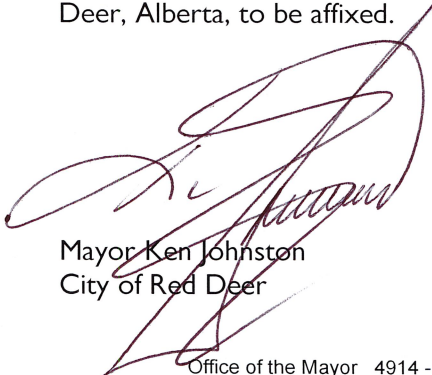
PROCLAMATION
