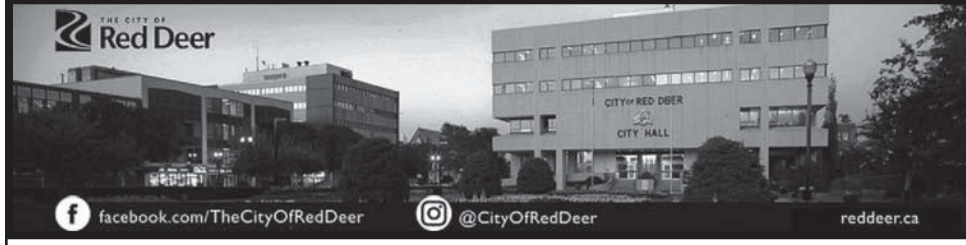
MUNICIPAL PLANNING COMMISSION DECISIONS

On May 20, 2026 the Municipal Planning Commission issued the following decisions for development permit applications.

Discretionary Use Denial:

A Development Permit application has been received and denied for the Permitted Use of an addition to an existing House with variances at 36 Owens Close, legally described as Lot 11; Block 31; Plan 9422419).

You may not appeal a permitted use unless it involves a relaxation, variation or misinterpretation of the Zoning Bylaw. NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING OF RED DEER CITY COUNCIL

Red Deer City Council will hold a Public Hearing on Tuesday June 9, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. in Council Chambers, 2nd Floor, City Hall to consider:

1. Lancaster South Neighbourhood Area Structure Plan Bylaw 3217/C-2026 & Zoning Bylaw 3357/V-2026 – an amendment to remove Direct Control Zone 35 and permit house suites in duplexes across all zones where duplexes are allowed. Should DC zone 35 be removed three (3) properties with this current zoning would be rezoned back to their previous zone including:
 - a. 34 Rutherford Dr - Rosedale Estates (Residential Duplex Zone: R-D)
 - b. 170 Lancaster Dr - Lancaster Green (Residential Duplex Zone: R-D)
 - c. 3802 47 St - Eastview (Residential Medium-Density Zone: R-M)
2. Zoning Bylaw Amendment Bylaw 3357/M-2026. An external application to rezone to I-C Industrial Commercial (Mixed-Use) Zone to better align with the intended use of the site and to support broader economic and community objectives. The proposed designation will enable the landowner to operate a business that requires a blend of industrial functionality and commercial accessibility.
3. Zoning Bylaw Amendment 3357/W-2026. An internal application to provide City staff and the public with clarity on how to process applications for charitable distribution centres. The proposed amendment aims to add "Charitable Distribution Centre" as a defined use, identify parking requirements, exclude it as a temporary use in residential zones, and allow it as a discretionary use in C-1 City Centre Commercial, C-1A City Centre West Commercial, C-4 Major Arterial Commercial, I-1 Industrial Business Service, I-C Industrial Commercial (Mixed-Use), PS Public Service (Institutional or Government), except 4240 59 St.

City Council will receive comments from any person claiming to be affected by the proposed bylaw and will consider these at the Public Hearing. The public is welcome to participate in this Public Hearing by submitting written comments or by participating in the Public Hearing in person. Members of the public may make a request to the Clerk to speak to a Public Hearing from a remote location. The request must be received by the Clerk by the end of the business day prior to the commencement of the Meeting during which the Public Hearing will be held. The Clerk will make reasonable efforts to accommodate the request.

Deadline to submit written comments is **4:30 p.m. on Friday, May 29, 2026**.

Late submissions will not be included in the published Council Agenda. Written comments must be received by the Clerk, Legislative Services by the deadline in order to be included in the published Council Agenda. Members can attend the Public Hearing to present their comments directly to Council during the Public Hearing. Members who wish to speak will have an opportunity to register directly prior to the commencement of the Public Hearing on a first come first serve basis.

Material(s) submitted for Council's consideration at the Public Hearing must form part of the public record and will appear on the Council Agenda in the same format that they are received by the Clerk. Personal information will not be redacted. The Clerk may withhold a public submission from the Council Agenda if the Clerk, after consulting legal counsel, concludes the submission contains: hate speech; discriminatory language; or defamatory language.

Members of the public may make a request to the Clerk to utilize technology to show images, videos, presentations and other visual aids during a Public Hearing. The request must be received by the Clerk by the end of the business day prior to the commencement of the Meeting during which the Public Hearing will be held. The Clerk will make reasonable efforts to accommodate the request.

Any person who wishes to address Council on this Public Hearing matter may do so for a period of five (5) minutes. The five (5) minutes does not include the time required to answer questions from City Council. Persons addressing Council shall limit their comments to this Public Hearing matter and the recommendations being discussed.

Effective May 9, 2022, new Public Hearing procedures are in effect in accordance with the City of Red Deer's Procedure Bylaw, for more information and to view our bylaw visit
